Introduction

This is an example of how submitted abstracts will appear in the final conference booklet; **it is not intended as a guide for how to format your own abstract**. Please enclose in your document unformatted text and separate pages containing pictures and/or tables.

About the Document

This document provides an example of the style for abstracts to be presented at the ninth lunar and planetary laboratory conference. Unlike in previous years the formatting of the abstract booklet will be handled by the LPLC organizing committee comprised of Jade Bond, John Moores and Maki Hattori. As such, we are asking authors to submit **a single unformatted document in one of Adobe PDF, Post Script, Microsoft word, or plain text (if not submitting images or tables)** which contains all text, title, authorship, any equations and up to two images or tables.

By formatting all documents alike we hope to provide a professional product which will not only be a useful guide during the conference, but a document that will provide a useful reference in the future to the activities being conducted within our research community.

A Word on Limits

A strict limit of **500 words (700 words if no images or tables are submitted)** is being placed on all abstracts in order to keep the length of each abstract in the conference booklet to approximately one page. We ask that each abstract contain **no more than two images or tables**. There is no limit on the number of equations which may be included. Please note that these limits are maximums only. For reference this document contains 373 words.

Images and Formatting

In order to preserve image quality please provide all images, figures or tables on separate pages of your submitted document at full resolution. No special formatting of this document is required.

Titles and Authorship

Please provide the title of your talk or poster presentation within the text along with the names of all authors, indicating the presenting author with an asterisk. If desired, you may include a correspondence email address.

Submitting

Abstracts may be submitted online on the LPLC website (figure 1).
